### Cybercrime and Online Safety Training Wednesday 18th November 2020 2pm – 3:30pm

The coronavirus pandemic has meant that many of us are working remotely at home, socialising, shopping and educating our children online, which makes it more important than ever that we do everything we can to stay safe online. Over the last few months, lots of people, who were reluctant to embrace technology, have been forced to do so, often with limited digital skills and reduced support networks, thus increasing their risk.

Cybercrime now accounts for over 33% of all crime recorded nationally and is the one crime that people are more likely to fall victim to. Derby and Derbyshire Safeguarding Adult Boards are working with community safety, the police and other partners to raise the importance of online safety and reduce the risk of Derbyshire residents becoming victims of any form of cybercrime.
